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***Mandarin makes disaster recovery easier, more efficient and less damaging***

One of our customers recently experienced a flood in the library when an air conditioning unit malfunctioned and soaked several banks of shelves. None of the wet materials could be salvaged, and the librarians were faced with identifying the individual items in order to calculate their replacement cost, create a list for insurance purposes and delete them from the database.

To organize a set of materials without having to search for each record, follow these steps to create a new Item Group in Group Editor.

- In Group Editor, click on the New button and choose New Item Group.
- Highlight the new group and click the Edit button.
- Under the General tab, type a name for the new group, such as "Flood-damaged Materials."
- Click the Apply button on the bottom right.
- Go to the Members tab, where you will first see a message that there are no members and click OK.
- Next to the word "Display," pull down the choices and choose "Scan Items into Current Group." A space will open up for you to enter barcodes to add items to this group. As soon as an item is scanned, it is moved from its original standard group to this one, but you should click on the Apply button every once in a while to make sure you are saving your changes.
- When you have completed scanning items, change the Display choice to "Items in Current Group Only" to see how many items are in the group and to double-check what you have entered.
- You now have identified all the damaged items so that you can print lists, call them up in Cataloging and make global changes and/or create a special report.
